They had worked hard over several weeks linking their Geography topic about 'North America' by researching the types of food, methods of food preparation, pricing and sourcing ingredients. Every small detail was covered for the 'Thanksgiving Day' meal, including Bespoke menu cards for their guests, dressing in check shirts and cowboy/girl hats, as well as great serving techniques.

The North American Broth, 'Coxhoe' Fried chicken and treacle tart, with custard, was thoroughly enjoyed by over 60 guests. At the end of the evening Mr Jones announced the cost of preparing the meal and asked the guests to pay what they thought the meal was worth, with any profit going to the Year 6 end of year Enterprise project. The evening resulted in over £100 towards their Enterprise project and has given a great start to this scheme, which they traditionally donate to the school at the end of Year 6.

Coxhoe Primary joins the 300+ group of schools!

As everyone will be aware, our community is getting larger! In November the result of this growth was noted as our school roll exceeded 300 pupils. We are enjoying the recent extension of the school which enables us to accommodate the growing number of pupils in our local area.

The new school capacity, follow the recent extension, is 355 pupils and we estimate that this total could be reached in the next 2 years.
